



Application to Foster an Elder Dog

ElderDog's mission is to support the relationship between ageing dogs and ageing people. When a special relationship between a dog and senior companion is disrupted or broken due to relocation, illness, or death ElderDog helps to find a loving new home for the dog. Sometimes, a dog might need to stay temporarily in a foster home until just the right forever home is found. We also provide temporary care in a foster home during a period of hospitalization or needed respite.

ElderDog does not have a shelter and relies upon its foster family volunteers to:

- provide love and care for the dog;
- provide food, exercise, and safe environment;
- transport the dog to and from veterinary and grooming appointments (if possible).

Fostering is a rewarding experience that helps dogs in need by allowing them to live in a home, with a family, while their caregiver is unavailable. Fostering is the alternative to keeping dogs isolated and provides comfort for owners and animals.

Fostering requires a commitment of your time and resources. You must be certain that your existing pets will accept the foster dog. Because older dogs may have special age-related needs or have experienced recent disruption or stress, we take extra care to find homes that best suit the needs and abilities of both dog and human. Our application processes help us place our dogs in homes that will enable the human-animal relationship to flourish.

In our Credo, we identify qualities such as dignity, respect, and comfort as underlying all that we do. We take care to ensure that all of our decisions regarding placement of dogs aligns with these values.
